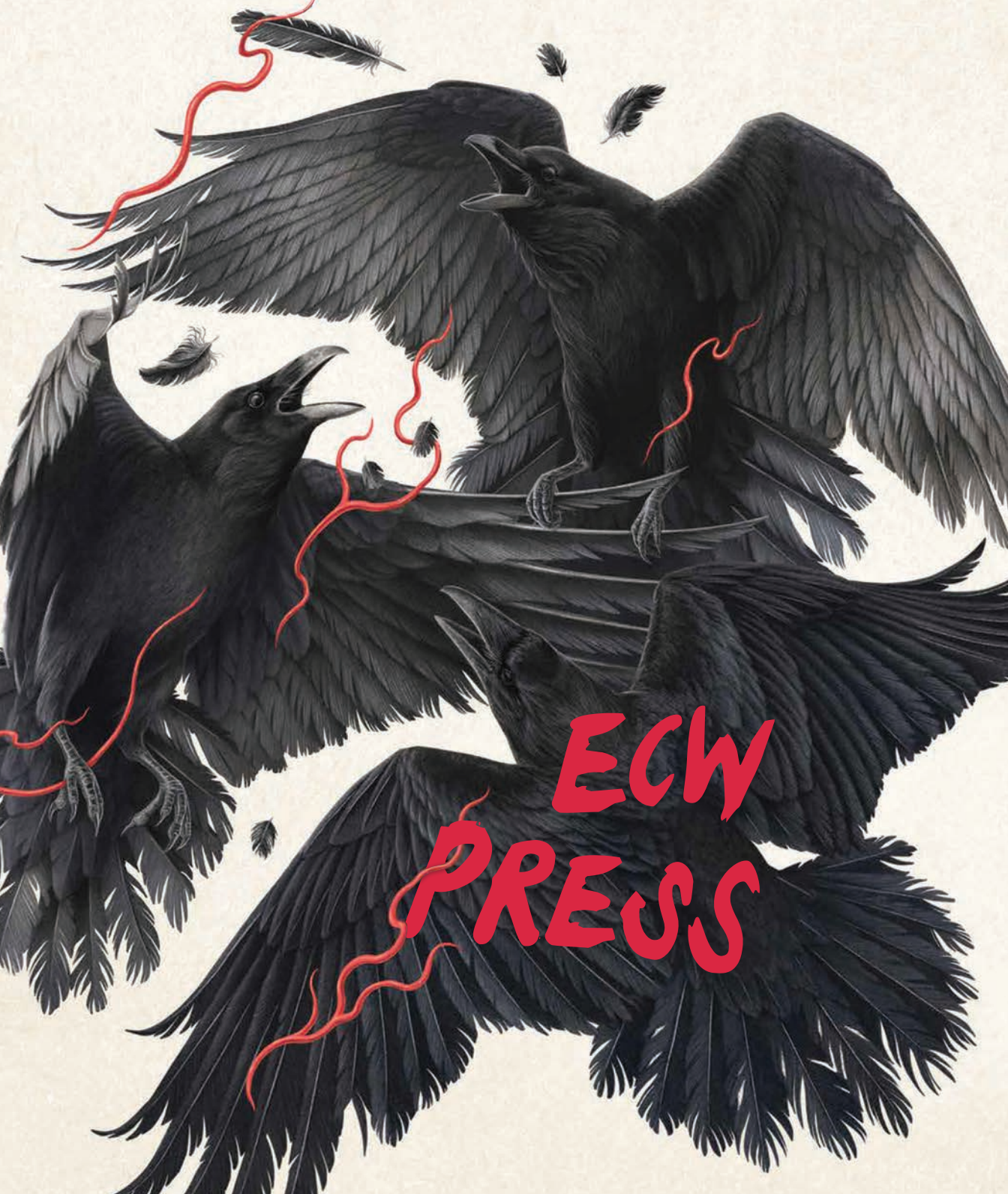

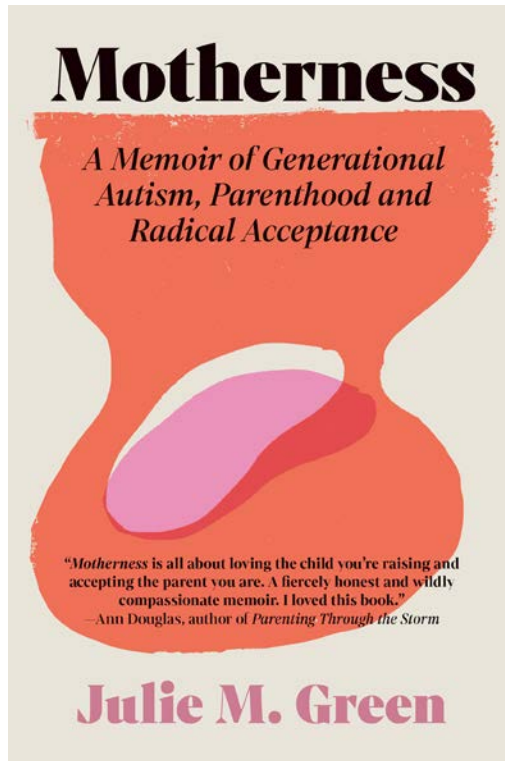

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MOTHERNESS

A MEMOIR OF GENERATIONAL AUTISM, PARENTHOOD, AND RADICAL ACCEPTANCE

Spanning 13 years — beginning with pregnancy and ending with diagnosis — *Motherness* offers a deeply personal account of an autistic mother raising an autistic child. It covers sensory processing, meltdowns, masking, empathy, bullying, special interests, and more. Tender and incisive, it's essential for adults and parents navigating their own autism diagnoses.

A funny, unflinchingly honest, and deeply compassionate memoir about one woman's experience of raising an autistic child while discovering she is also "on the spectrum"

Almost 10 years after learning that her son is autistic, Julie Green was also diagnosed, shedding light on a lifetime of feeling othered and misunderstood. *Motherness* traces Julie's journey from childhood to early motherhood, when she must advocate for her son while navigating her own struggles.

With more girls and women being diagnosed in the last decade — many of them later in life — the face of autism is changing. *Motherness* provides a rich, intensely personal account of what it is like to be autistic, through the lens of both a mother and child. Topics include sensory processing, meltdowns and shutdowns, masking, empathy, alexithymia, bullying, elopement, special interests, disordered eating, gender diversity, twice exceptionality, and more.

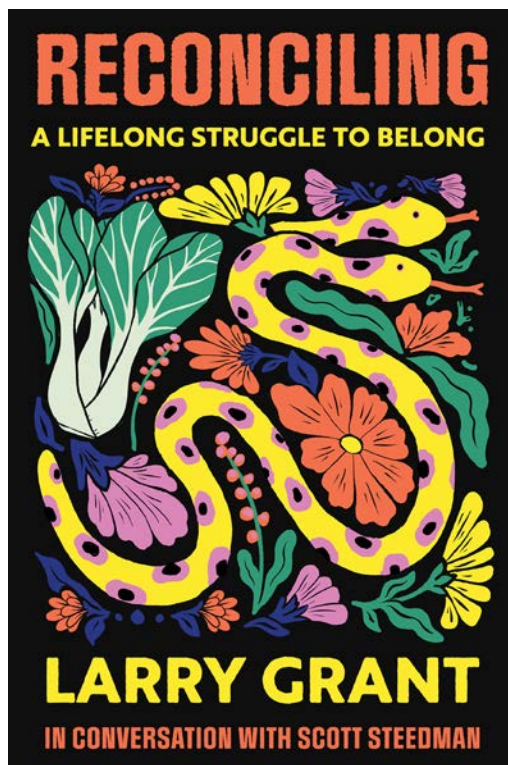
Motherness is a story about accepting your child while learning to accept yourself. This extraordinary, groundbreaking memoir speaks to the great challenges and great joys of autism, providing valuable insights to parents of autistic children, adults newly diagnosed or questioning their place on the spectrum, and anyone seeking a greater understanding of neurodiversity.

- **RELEVANT AND TIMELY:** *Motherness* will be published in time for October, Autism Acceptance Month in Canada. *Motherness* forms part of a broader narrative that is only beginning to be explored, and on social media platforms like Instagram and TikTok, posts about lesser-known traits of autism and people unmasking are incredibly popular.
- **PREVALENCE OF AUTISM:** The CDC reports that over 5.5M people are diagnosed with autism in the U.S. Currently, about one in every 36 children is diagnosed, though there's strong evidence the condition remains underdiagnosed among women, trans people, and people of color.
- **UNIQUE PERSPECTIVE:** Green offers a fresh voice in an area often dominated by two narratives: memoirs by autistic savant males and accounts by neurotypical parents of autistic children. This memoir is a deeply personal, honest look at autism through the experiences of a mother and her only child — by turns funny, messy, wonderful, and heartbreaking. Readers will feel seen in stories that don't sugarcoat the challenges and joys of autism.
- **CONNECTION BUILDING:** Parents, especially mothers, want to know that they are not alone. Readers may include autistic women, parents of autistic children, parents who suspect they may be autistic, girls and women who have never fit in and are now questioning their neurotype, professionals and clinicians working with autistic individuals and their families, as well as friends, relatives, and allies seeking insights into autistic life. Covering universal parenting topics such as emotions, bonding, difference and exclusion, and the parenting challenges that feel like disasters, *Motherness* offers a point of connection for many people.

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RECONCILING

A LIFELONG STRUGGLE TO BELONG

Larry Grant and Scott Steedman

A celebration and in-depth exploration of Canada's West Coast through an Indigenous and immigrant lens, *Reconciling* weaves together personal tales and tough histories for guiding steps toward true understanding.

A personal and historical story of identity, place, and belonging from a Musqueam-Chinese Elder caught between cultures

It's taken most of Larry Grant's long life for his extraordinary heritage to be appreciated. He was born in a hop field outside Vancouver in 1936, the son of a Musqueam cultural leader and an immigrant from a village in Guangdong, China. In 1940, when the Indian agent discovered that their mother had married a non-status man, Larry and his two siblings were stripped of their status, suddenly labeled "bastard children." With one stroke of the pen, they were no longer recognized as Indigenous.

In *Reconciling*, Larry tells the story of his life, including his thoughts on reconciliation and the path forward for First Nations and Canada. His life echoes the barely known story of Vancouver — and most cities in the Americas, from Cusco to Mexico City, from New York to Toronto. It combines Indigenous traditions with key events of the last two centuries, including Chinese immigration and the Head Tax, the ravages of residential schools, and now Indigenous revival and the accompanying change in worldview. Each chapter takes the form of a series of conversations between Larry and writer Scott Steedman and is built around one pivotal geographical place and its themes, including the Musqueam reserve, Chinatown, the site of the Mission Residential School, the Vancouver docks, and the University of British Columbia.

When Larry talks about reconciliation, he uses the verb *reconciling*, an ongoing, unfinished process we're all going through, Indigenous and settler, immigrant and Canadian-born. "I have been reconciling my whole life, with my inner self," he explains. "To not belong was forced upon me by the colonial society that surrounded me. But reconciling with myself is part of all that."

Larry Grant is the Elder-in-residence at the Justice Institute of BC and the University of British Columbia's First Nations House of Learning. He holds a President's Medal from UBC and an honorary Doctor of Laws from Simon Fraser University. He lives with his wife on the Musqueam reserve in Vancouver.

Scott Steedman has worked in publishing for 35 years, including roles with Dorling Kindersley, Larousse, Raincoast, and Douglas & McIntyre. He teaches publishing at Simon Fraser University and is co-author of *Art for War and Peace*. He lives in Vancouver, BC.

- **WHAT RECONCILIATION MEANS:** Larry Grant focuses not only on reconciling the atrocities committed against Indigenous people in Canada but also on reconciling the various parts of his own identity and how his cultural pasts can coexist. Grant recounts losing his Indigenous status in 1940 due to being half Chinese and explains what reclaiming his heritage means for himself, First Nations people, and all Canadians.
- **CELEBRATED AUTHOR:** Steedman's 2010 book, *Visions of British Columbia*, won the 2011 Vancouver Book Award and was shortlisted for a 2011 BC Book Award, and his 2015 book, *Art for War and Peace*, won the 2016 Benjamin Franklin Award. *The Egyptian News* (1998) has been translated into eight languages.

His mother called him "Bobby Mountain." Elders called him "Great Man." His people called him "Chief." Oil men called him "Mr. Cree." But the government called him "Number 53." Robert Cree was all of these while facing his people's oppressors and freeing the ghosts of tortured spirits.

The Many Names of Robert Cree is his first-person account of survival in a brutally racist residential school system designed to erase traditional Indigenous culture, language, and knowledge. It is also the story of an epic life of struggle and healing, as Cree takes the wisdom of his ancestors and a message of reconciliation to the halls of government and to industry boardrooms.

In the storytelling tradition of his people, Cree recounts his early years in the bush, his captivity at a residential school, his struggles with addiction, his political awakening as one of Canada's youngest First Nation Chiefs, and the rising Indigenous activism of the late 20th and early 21st centuries. He also recounts the oil industry's arrival on his poverty-stricken reserve and the ensuing struggle to balance economic opportunity with environmental challenges.

Throughout, Cree's leadership is rooted in his unshakable commitment to the sacred traditional teachings of his people. His beliefs give him the strength to focus on hope, dignity, and building a better future for his community. Now a respected Elder and spiritual leader, Cree champions forgiveness as a powerful force that can bring healing and transformation for all.

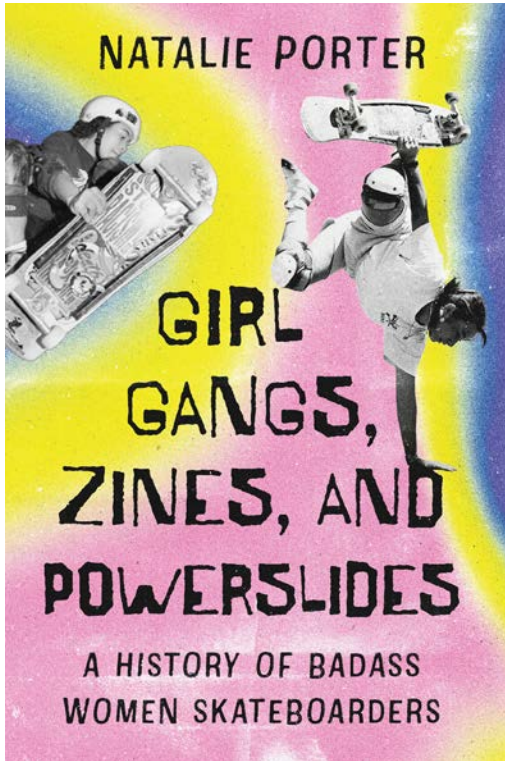
Elder and Knowledge Keeper **Robert Cree** is widely respected as a spiritual leader, teacher, and businessman. He is the former Chief of Fort McMurray First Nation 468, where he still resides.

The former Chief of Fort McMurray First Nation 468, Cree was elected one of Canada's youngest First Nation Chiefs at only 27 years old. Porter shines a spotlight on the unsung women, BIPOC pioneers, and queer trailblazers who helped propel skateboarding to the Olympics, highlighting the need to validate the stories of older women often ignored by the industry. While not always the most famous or talented, these individuals were essential in driving change and inspired Porter to combat archival silence. With rare images and powerful stories, this book honors the blood, sweat, and tears of these groundbreaking individuals, paving the way for today's youth.

A vibrant, meticulously researched celebration of the women and non-binary skateboarders who defied a hostile industry and redefined skateboarding around the world

The experiences of heroic older women have traditionally been dismissed or buried in the history books, and the skateboarding industry has mirrored this trend. The conversation has focused on the iconic male professionals, their contest results, trick inventions, and sponsors, while female skateboarders rarely get mentioned beyond a token paragraph, and stories of their contributions and barrier-breaking have almost never been told. Until now.

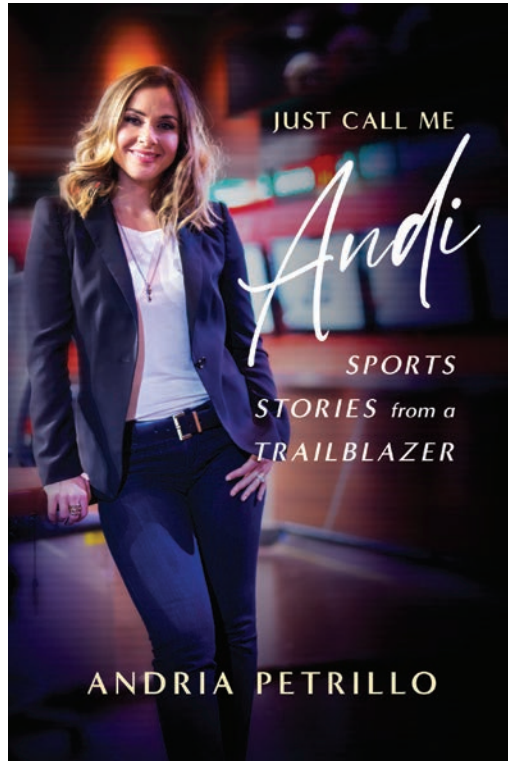
With enthusiasm and empathy, *Girl Gangs, Zines, and Powerslides* celebrates the relentless participation of women in skateboarding from the 1960s onward who defied a hostile industry to carve out their own space through underground networks. Skater librarian Natalie Porter presents interviews and meticulous research, including the DIY zines created by female and non-binary skaters to expose this unacknowledged story while offering a personal narrative about the importance of community-building and validation, with or without your own video game.

Natalie Porter lives in Powell River on the traditional territory of the Tla'amin First Nation, began skateboarding in 1995, and works for the British Columbia Library Association. She is the founder of @womxnsk8history on Instagram and the online archive *Womxn Skateboard History* and is a subject expert for the Smithsonian's skateboarding advisory board.

- **SKATEBOARDING WILL BE A MANDATORY SPORT IN THE 2028 L.A. OLYMPICS.**
- **UNTOLD FEMINIST HISTORY:** Spanning 1959 to today, this book focuses on California (the birthplace of skateboarding), Vancouver (Canada's skateboarding hub), and Montreal, where Porter was a part of the Skirtboarders girl gang. She covers the 1980s and 1990s, when skateboarding was marketed as a space for young men, and how diverse skaters challenged this narrative. Porter openly addresses challenging subjects, such as violence against women and the impact of the #MeToo movement, both of which have significantly shaped the world of women's skateboarding.
- **CONFRONTING TONY HAWK:** Natalie Porter tracked down and met pro skater Tony Hawk at a skateboarding conference in San Diego and grilled him with a question about women's skate history. She details how Tony Hawk responded in the book.
- **BRINGING IN A NEW KIND OF READER:** This book transcends skateboarding, captivating historians, academics, pop culture buffs, and readers of feminist biographies like *Rebel Girl: My Life as a Feminist Punk* (Kathleen Hanna, 2024). Blending academic history with the DIY spirit of zines and skate mags, it speaks to readers of *Thrasher Magazine*, viewers of the documentary *Underexposed* (2012), attendees of events like California's Exposure Skateboard Contest, Skate Like a Girl advocates, and zinefest regulars alike.

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JUST CALL ME “ANDI”

SPORTS STORIES FROM A TRAILBLAZER

Andria Petrillo

For readers of sports broadcasting tell-alls like Jay Onrait’s *Anchorboy* or James Duthie’s *The Guy on the Left* comes Andi Petrillo’s candid memoir. She explores the sexism she’s faced and the relationships she’s built, offering an underreported, crucial perspective on sports broadcasting from one of North America’s top female sportscasters.

When Andi Petrillo decided to pursue a career in sportscasting, a woman offering her opinion on sports was still a novelty. She was constantly being criticized, scrutinized, and sexualized, but her love for sports — and her determination to prove she deserved to be doing what she loved — propelled her into a successful and historic career. From becoming the first woman to be part of the *Hockey Night in Canada* in-studio broadcast, to being the first woman to host a daily sports radio talk show in Canada (*Leafs Lunch* on TSN), to being the first woman to win a Canadian Screen Award for Best Sports Host, she’s come to see her perseverance as inspiration for young women who now believe they too can achieve great things in sports broadcasting.

Just Call Me “Andi” shares many of the obstacles Petrillo’s faced, as well as the incredible friendships she’s made, and the lessons she’s learned along the way. It also provides a behind-the-scenes look into the industry, explaining why editorial and broadcast decisions are often made and how the broadcasting world has evolved in the era of streaming and social media.

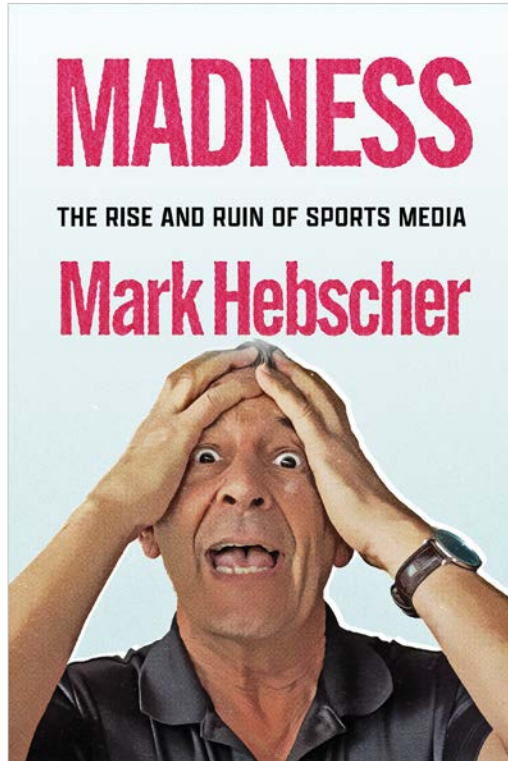
Women have come a long way in sportscasting, but it may surprise people to learn about the pervasive sexism and the downright ridiculous requests that are still made of women that are not made of men ... Petrillo’s story is both heartbreakingly honest and deeply insightful, providing a roadmap for future broadcasters navigating similar challenges so that female voices in sport are the norm, not the exception.

Andi Petrillo grew up playing a variety of sports. She turned her passion into a career, and over the years, Petrillo has become one of the premier voices in Canada for hockey, soccer, and the Olympics. Andi lives in Toronto, ON, with her husband, Jon, and their two dogs, Pepper and Ginger.

- **A MASSIVE PLATFORM AND A PIONEER IN SPORTS BROADCASTING:** Andi Petrillo has a loyal following with 80K followers on X and 29K on Instagram. She joined Leafs TV in 2006, reporting on Toronto Maple Leafs and Marlies games, and expanded into sports like lacrosse, basketball, and soccer, covering the Toronto Raptors and Toronto FC. In 2011, Petrillo made history as the first female full-time member of *Hockey Night in Canada*’s studio team. She anchored CBC’s coverage of major events, such as the 2014 Winter Olympics and FIFA World Cup. In 2016, she became the first woman in Canada to host a daily sports talk radio show with *Leafs Lunch* on TSN. Petrillo also worked as an analyst for OneSoccer and hosted pre-game coverage for the 2016 MLS Cup. She won the Canadian Screen Award for Best Sports Host in 2022 and co-hosted *Prime Monday Night Hockey* on Amazon Prime Video in 2024, further solidifying her status as a trailblazer in sports broadcasting.
- **A FEMALE PERSPECTIVE:** While there have been several sportscasting memoirs written by prominent sports journalists like James Duthie, Steve Dangle, Jay Onrait, and Ken Reid, there are so few written by a woman in the industry. With the explosion of the PWHL, Toronto’s acquisition of a WNBA team, and female-focused sports news outlets like The GIST, it is clear that there is an appetite for fresh and dynamic perspectives. This book contributes to the push for the voices of women in sports to become the norm, not the exception.

From dealing with the cantankerous and cheapskate owner of the Toronto Maple Leafs to hosting radio hotline shows to anchoring a revolutionary late-night program, *Sportsline*, Mark Hebscher finally tells the unheard stories from his 45 years in the bizarre business of sports broadcasting.

How would you react if hockey superstar Wayne Gretzky sweated all over your dress pants during a live TV interview? What if heavyweight boxing champion Leon Spinks threatened to harm you if you didn't dance with his wife? These are just two of the occupational obstacles faced by Mark Hebscher during his checkered career in sports media. In the end, Hebscher's encounters with the Great One, MC Hammer, Youppi!, Doug Flutie, and Doug Gilmour are more than mildly amusing . . . and his unparalleled knowledge of the sports media universe shines throughout.

As co-anchor of the wildly popular show *Sportsline* on Global TV, **Mark Hebscher** helped revolutionize the way sports is presented on television. He spent 45 years in sports media and is a foremost expert on everything sports. Mark resides in Toronto, ON.

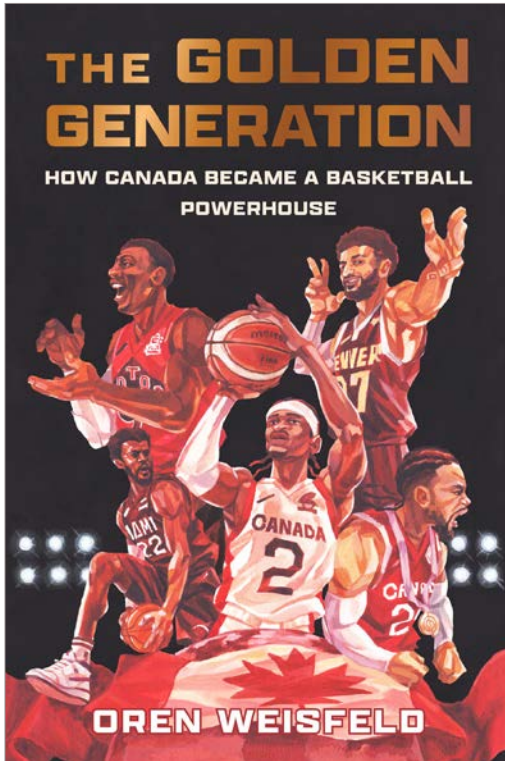

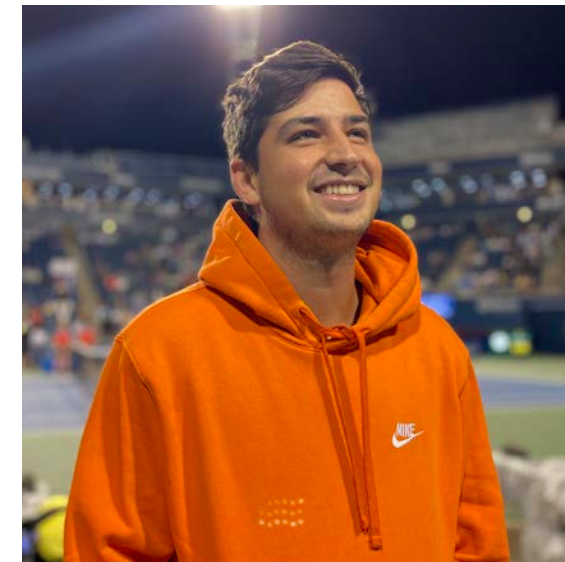

In *The Golden Generation*, sports journalist Oren Weisfeld uncovers the growth of Canadian basketball through the lens of Team Canada and its most influential figures, alternating between chronicling key moments in the rise of the Canadian men's national team and profiling key figures in the grassroots basketball landscape. Through over 100 original interviews with athletes, coaches, and behind-the-scenes power brokers, *The Golden Generation* explores the role racism played in the national team's early struggles, how pioneers like Cory Joseph and Tristan Thompson paved a new path for high schoolers to follow before Jamal Murray recreated it, the enigma that is Andrew Wiggins, and the backstories of the core group of players that brought Canada back to the Olympics, including superstar Shai Gilgeous-Alexander.

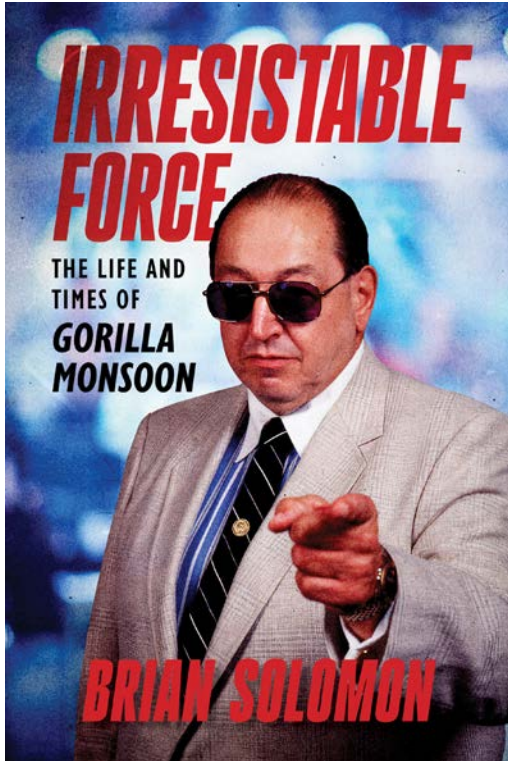
Canadian basketball has come a long way over the past two decades, with a record 24 current NBA players, a sophisticated grassroots infrastructure, and a top-ranked national team. But many trailblazers had to take their hits to lay the foundation for the current generation to thrive. *The Golden Generation* puts all the pieces and players together to explain how Canada became a basketball country with a bright future ahead.

In 1970, Scott McIntyre cofounded what became Canadian publisher Douglas & McIntyre. In the intervening years, he has watched the rise and fall of publishers, booksellers, and book trends from every corner of the industry. Becoming one of Canada's largest and most respected publishing houses and among the first to embrace Indigenous issues, Douglas & McIntyre and its associated children's publisher, Groundwood Books, published some 900 authors and 2,000 books in less than 50 years. For McIntyre, the authors always came first, and he worked closely with many important figures, including Doris Shadbolt, Wayson Choy, Richard Wagamese, Anna Porter, Will Ferguson, Doug Coupland, Hugh Brody, Robert Bringhurst, Wade Davis, and Farley Mowat.

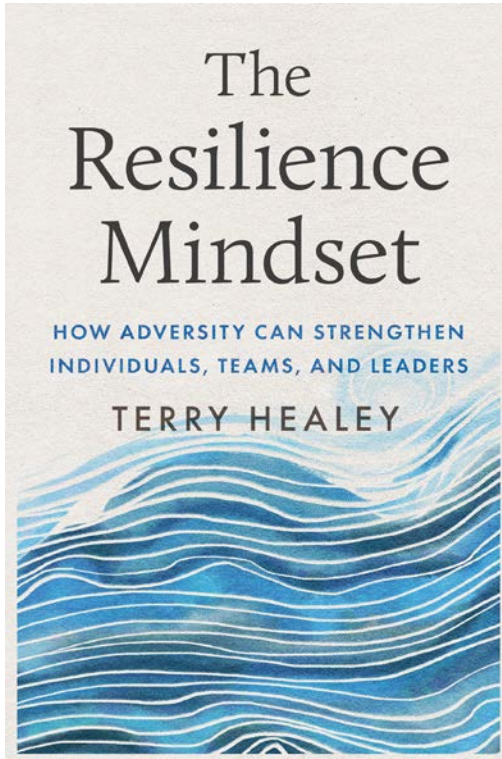

Offering the atmosphere of *Twin Peaks* and the queer camaraderie of comic strip *Dykes to Watch Out For*, *Veal* is a thrilling exploration of friendship, fear, and the thin line between justice and vengeance.

Delores “Lawrence” Franklin is a failed capitalist and a runaway headcase. Following a corporate meltdown, she decides to start fresh in Mistaken Point, a small town known for two things — Mistaken Point University, where she and her best friend, Anastasia Lanes, are now enrolled, and the grisly murders of countless young women.

At her new part-time arcade job, Lawrence meets Francesca “Franky” Delores — gritty, off-putting, and chronically serious, as opposite to Lawrence as her name would suggest. Soon, Lawrence discovers Franky is convinced there is a monster on the loose, a patchwork creature born of hatred and responsible for the supposedly solved string of violence haunting the town.

Against the advice of Franky’s closest friend, Pippa, Lawrence, and Stasia join Franky in a sticky, summertime search for a yellow-eyed monster between classes, shifts at the arcade, and eating popsicles by the pool. Motivated mostly by her unquenchable attraction to Franky, Lawrence allows herself to be pulled in strange directions, trying to appease Franky’s mania. Through the trials of hunting a monster only some of them believe in, Pippa, Lawrence, Stasia, and Franky discover truths about womanhood, relationships, and the reliability of urban legends.

Mackenzie Nolan was born and raised in Newfoundland. Working professionally as a social worker for several years, she found herself better suited to writing interpersonal dynamics rather than solving them. She lives in St. John’s, NL. *Veal* is her debut novel.

PRINCESS NAI AND OTHER STORIES

From award-winning author Jamal Saeed comes a collection of stories written in the dark of a Syrian prison. These gripping tales highlight his work as an activist, artist, and author, shedding light on Syria's ongoing humanitarian crisis and the enduring power of hope.

Jamal Saeed wrote the stories in this collection during different stages of his life, but most originated while he was a prisoner of conscience in one of the worst prisons in the world. Other stories were composed after the Syrian uprising in 2011. One story — written in 2009 when he was still in Syria — is about a mythical olive tree that the Syrian military would eventually destroy. Canada plays a role too: Two of the stories were rewritten after his family finally escaped Syria and landed in Kingston, Ontario.

In these stories, reality and imagination coexist, and again and again the reader arrives at the truth by exploring the imaginary. Most of Saeed's pieces include a poetic scene that enables the reader to engage with various characters' fresh dreams (or their scattered and shattered dreams, as the case may be). Love, beauty, despair, hope, the longing for freedom, the search for lost time, and the impact of the past all coexist and vie for supremacy. Here too there is betting on the future (along with mockery of every kind of bet).

In the end, these stories open windows to the inner world of the human soul — and it is also true that every one of Saeed's stories is based upon a solid fact.

Jamal Saeed spent 12 years as a prisoner of conscience in Syria before being invited to Canada. He continues to raise awareness about Syria's humanitarian crisis through his work as an activist, visual artist, and author. He lives in Kingston, ON. His memoir, *My Road from Damascus*, was shortlisted for the Hilary Weston Prize.

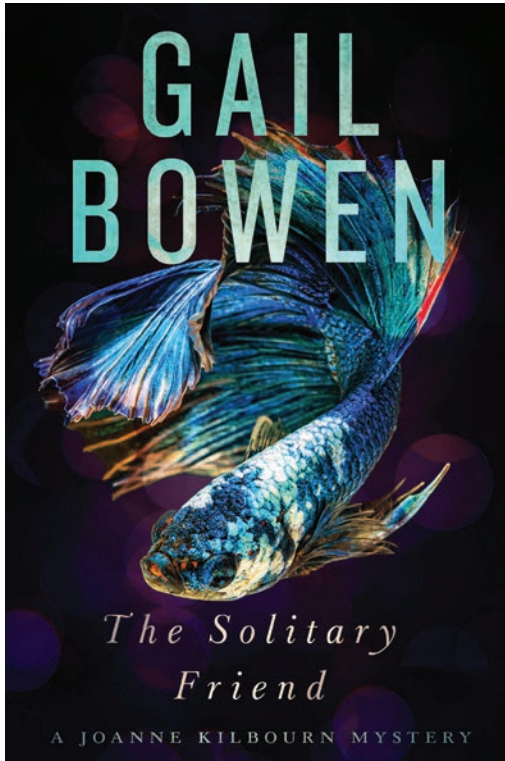

With her loved ones’ happiness — and their very lives — at stake, Joanne races to find the source of the mysterious messages before they make good on their menacing ultimatum.

AN ORANGE, A SYLLABLE

Gillian Sze

A wandering meditation on motherhood, language, and art and a parallaxic and slow amble through private rooms and interiors. The result is a woman ricocheting off the bounds of marriage, memory, and herself.

The latest book by Gillian Sze, author of the Pat Lowther Memorial Award-winning book *Quiet Night Think*

This prosimetrical work is a meditation on motherhood, language, and art. The central speaker witnesses the earliest utterances of her child and launches into a poetic inquiry of words themselves, asking, *How to measure one's mouth by its words?* The speaker seeks an answer amidst the language that surrounds her — words misspoken, mispronounced, remembered, unwritten — and, in doing so, struggles with signification and significance.

Each prose poem in the five-part collection darts between the many meanings of “fit” — as in “a sudden burst of emotion” or “to be the right size and shape” and the archaic “fytte” (a section of a poem). A text becomes an open mouth, a square day of a calendar, or a bare fragment of a narrative. The final section of the book is an intimate and ekphrastic engagement with the work of Danish painter Vilhelm Hammershøi. Drawn to Hammershøi’s paintings of the empty rooms of his apartment, the speaker recognizes a familiar space of art’s insistence.

An Orange, A Syllable details a period of maternal and artistic transformation.

Gillian Sze is the author of multiple poetry books and picture books. Her book of poems and essays, *Quiet Night Think*, received the Pat Lowther Memorial Award. She lives in Montreal, QC, where she teaches creative writing and literature at Concordia University.

These poems explore the tension between the synthetic and authentic, raising hope for an escape from MCHNCT (Machine City) to NMLCT (Animal City), where “real life” might still exist.

Imagine *The Matrix* retold by the reanimated cyborg bodies of the Brothers Grimm.

Fables and fairytales collide with virtual reality, artificial intelligence, and monstrous myths in a world where no one knows what to believe. In his eighth book of poems, Paul Vermeersch responds to the increasing difficulty of knowing what is real and what isn't, what is our genuine experience and what is constructed for us by The Algorithm. In a “post-truth” society rife with simulations, misinformation, and computer-generated hallucinations, these poems explore the relationship between the synthetic and the authentic as they raise hope for the possibility of escape from MCHNCT (Machine City) to NMLCT (Animal City), where the promise of “real life” still exists.

These poems — all precisely 16 lines long, identically formed as though mass-produced — are themselves artificial creations, products of the imagination, sometimes disorienting but always vivid. They hold up a mirror not only to nature but also to its unnatural distortions and facsimiles. In *NMLCT*, Vermeersch gives us his answer to an existence in thrall to the artificial. But it also foretells a different future, one where the air and the grass and the trees, and all the life they engender, might always be genuine and sensed and safe.

Paul Vermeersch is a poet, multimedia artist, and literary editor. His last book of poetry was *Shared Universe: New and Selected Poems 1995–2020*. A professor of creative writing and publishing at Sheridan College, he also edits his own imprint, Buckrider Books, for Wolsak & Wynn Publishers. He lives in Toronto, ON.

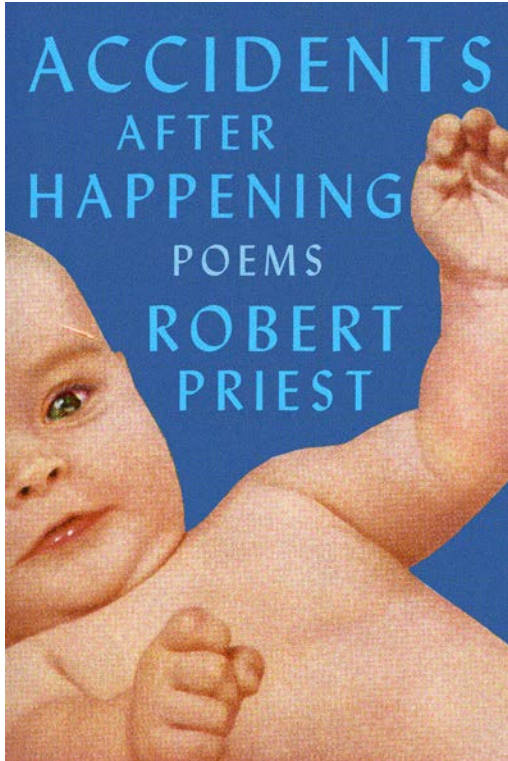

Accidents After Happening is for anyone who has a taste for immediate, meaningful poetry that sings, laments, and decries but also celebrates life in our modern world.

The accidents of Priest's collection are definitely not all "happy." They move through a full range of human emotions: dread, grief, anger, ecstasy, lust, and empathy. Plus some magic levity. This is poetry you will want to recite aloud: lyrical love poems, sonnets, satires, ghazals, curses, and bitter invective. These are not snobby poems — they want and welcome readers who love euphony, who enjoy tasteful eroticism, who rage at injustice. People who grieve and gush — smart people who think critically and form their own opinions. And for those with a taste for "brevity forever." *Accidents After Happening* also contains a whole new catalog of Priest's aphorisms, proverbs, maxims, and sayings — the kind of work that recently prompted Canadian literary icon Margaret Atwood to take to Twitter and praise Priest's "snappy, funny, spot-on micro poems — plus much more."

Priest is a people's poet who believes that humanity harbors a deep and ancient biological need for the spirit and time-binding experiences of the incantatory and shamanistic and that these can only be acquired through the poetic outlook. 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The ECW office is situated on land that was the traditional territory of many nations, including the Wendat, the Anishinaabeg, Haudenosaunee, Chippewa, Métis, and the Mississaugas of the Credit, the latter of whom completed negotiation of a Treaty No. 13 known as the "Toronto Purchase" begun in 1787, negotiated in 1805, and re-negotiated in 2010. It was a sandy oak savannah on a hill rising westward from Heward Creek, one of Toronto's lost ravines. In the 1880s, the land was developed as part of a growing community around St. Matthew's Anglican and other churches. In the 1950s, our neighborhood, now known as East Chinatown, was transformed by people moving into the area, dispossessed by the building of Nathan Phillips Square and subsequent rise in real estate value in Old Chinatown, and immigrants fleeing the Vietnam War. We are grateful to those who cared for the land before us, and we are proud to be working now amidst this mix of cultures.

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
